Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE)

(for Lateral Move into Counter Intelligence or EOD (MOS 02xx or 23xx))

This is a 90 minute Test of Adult Basic Education that measures a student's current Reading, Language, and Math skills.

Tests are administered in the Coastal Carolina Learning Lab, Room 214, Building 825, between 1000 to 1400 hours Monday through Friday, and 1700 to 2000 hours Monday through Thursday.

Students must present this screening sheet in order to test.

(Marines must come and pick up a screening screen for the TABE test)

NELSON DENNY READING TEST (NDRT)

MOS 4422-Legal Services Court Reporter)

Must be MOS 4421 to take this test with approval from the legal section supervisor.

This test is 35 minutes that measures a student's current vocabulary and comprehension.

This test is administered in the John A Lejeune Education Center building-825, room-120 between the hours of 1000-1400 Monday thru Thursday and 1000-1100 Friday



FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY BONUS (FLPB) PROGRAM

- The FLPP is intended to provide incentive pay to Marines with demonstrated foreign language skills
- Officers and enlisted personnel who have demonstrated a capability in a validated foreign language.
- Marine Corps per FLPB: MCO 7220.52F
- Navy order per FLPB: OPNAVINST 7220.7F
- There are 21 languages that are assigned to the restrictive list for FLPB payment. These languages WILL NOT be paid to the marine unless they are in a certain MOS. To find out what languages are on this list come to room-120 and ask about the up-dated MarAdmin published by HQMC around the end of the year.

OFFICIAL ORAL PROFICIENCY INTERVIEW (OPI)

- Specialized language proficiency assessments will normally be comprised of an Oral Proficiency Interview consisting of a 30-45 minute phone dialogue between a certified instructor and the Marine/Sailor being tested. This test is designed to validate listening/speaking proficiency.
- The "DATE & TIME" of the OPI test will be set by Defense Language Institution. The persons requesting the OPI test must inform Camp Lejeune Testing Center personnel if they will deploy before DLI provides the time and date of the OPI test. The availability of the person requesting the OPI test must be provided to the Testing Center personnel or the test will be voided

DEFENSE LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY TEST (DLPT)

Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) is designed as the standard tests for determining proficiency in foreign languages. DLPT contains two subtests: Listen and Reading.

- There are 20 computers available for testing
- The test is approximately 6 hours long, depending on the tester's knowledge of the language.
- The tester must receive a **SKILL LEVEL** of a "2" to be eligible for FLPP payment.

Marine Personnel: There are 21 languages listed as "Prevalent in the Force" that are restricted in receiving Foreign Language Proficiency Bonus (FLPB) unless they are in a certain MOS. To find out which language is on this list call (910) 451-3092 or email: paul.parker@usmc-mccs.org.

ARMED FORCES CLASSIFICATION TEST (AFCT) MARINE PERSONNEL:

- The **AFCT** is a computer based test. You have 2 hours and 34 minutes to complete the test.
- All enlisted Marines will not be allowed to retest without first obtaining written authorization from his/her command at the battalion/squadron level and provide copy of their old **AFCT** scores from 3270 (not MOL).
- You must register for the test prior to the day of the test, to ensure the paper work is correct.

OTHER MILITARY SERVICES: Air Force, Coast Guard, Navy, and Army

- The **AFCT** is a computer based test. You have 2 hours and 34 minutes to complete the test.
- All enlisted service member will not be allowed to retest without first obtaining written authorization from his/her Commanding Officer of the unit they are assigned to. SEE MILITARY TESTING COORDINATOR.

DEFENSE LANGUAGE APTITUDE BATTERY (DLAB)

- Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB) is designed to measure a Marine's potential to learn a foreign language and to aid in the selection of personnel for language school training. The DLAB may be taken by personnel applying or considered for assignment to language training.
- The computer test is approximately 90 minutes long.
- The score you receive will assist DLI in assigning the training you will needed for the language. The categories are listed below.

- a. **Category I: 95 or higher** (Dutch, French, Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish)
- b. **Category II: 100 or higher** (German)
- c. **Category III: 105 or higher** (Belorussian, Czech, Greek, Hebrew, Persian, Polish, Russian, Serbian/Croatian, Slovak, Tagalog [Filipino], Thai, Turkish, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese)
- d. **Category IV: 110 or higher** (Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, and Korean)
